### **National Lineman Appreciation Day**

Every day there are men and women who enter extreme peril to protect our lives, and bring us all the conveniences of modern living. They dangle dozens to hundreds of feet above the ground on precarious harnesses, dancing between snakelike wires that, if improperly handled, can easily erase their lives in a massive jolt of electricity while simultaneously blacking out entire sections of the city. Lineman Appreciation Day celebrates those men and women who put their lives at risk to keep the power flowing through our communities.

### **History of Lineman Appreciation Day**

Linemen have existed for as long as electricity has been a standard part of modern living. Without them there would be no power lines carrying electricity to our homes and businesses, keeping the lights on and the furnaces going, and ensuring that we have the warm glow of the TV to curl up around \*Jim States\* as the night creeps in. Linemen are often called to do their jobs in the most dangerous of conditions and facing the worst weather the world has to offer. After all, we rarely lose power on a windless sunny day, now do we? Of course, even the best of conditions leaves them handling wires that carry thousands of volts of electricity pushing thousands of Amps (that's the stuff that kills you) every day. But when the chips are down and Mother Nature is doing her worst, these are the people who will be out there restoring power, setting up emergency systems to carry us through, and putting life back in order when the storms have finally passed. There are 115,000 linemen in the US alone, which

puts the fact that 67,000 of them responded to Superstorm Sandy into perspective.



#### Dishwasher Efficiency Tip:

Air dry clean dishes to save energy. If your dishwasher does not have an automatic air-dry switch, turn off the dishwasher after the final rinse and prop the door open slightly so the dishes will dry faster.

#### SAVINGS + COMFORT

Electric storage heating systems convert electricity into heat during offpeak hours when the demand for electricity is low. The Stored heat is distributed later, as needed, to heat your home 24 hours a day. These systems qualify for lower rates and may be eligible for rebates. There are two basic systems.

- Electric radiant floor heat ETS Storage Heater electric cable, electric mats
- Electric thermal storage (ETS) room units/central heating systems

**Off-Peak Storage Heating** 

Winter: On-Peak \$.13 kWh Winter: Off Peak \$.06 kWh Summer: All kWh \$.12 kWh
