

Wyoming Public Service Update!!!

Information on our Wyoming Public Service Commission changes for 2023. The amount of the EFA (Electrical Facilities Allowance) is based on the cost to add a 200-amp electric service to an existing pole. The EFA is currently \$2,400.00 from the last time we reviewed it in 2017. At this time, it costs \$3,136.00 to install a 200amp electric service. By increasing the EFA, the monthly pay back for underutilization of the electric service would increase from \$66.67 per month to \$87.11 per month.

The net metering avoided cost shall be established by utilizing the wholesale power supplier's avoided cost in accordance with Wyoming State Statute § 37-2-122 (d)(i) of the previous calendar year. This rate shall remain in effect for the entire previous calendar year, unless the wholesale power supplier increases or decreases its rates to Carbon, in which case the rate will automatically apply.

Net Metering Avoided Cost: The kWh rate will lower to \$0.01632 from \$0.042040 due to this adjustment. In accordance with Wyo. State S § 37-2-122 (d)(i), which states in part that a distribution cooperatives avoided cost is the wholesale power supplier's avoided cost.
