
District 1 Board Member Debbie Reichert (left) receives her CCD certificate from Board President Jim Rogers at a recent Carbon Power & Light Board meeting.

The Wyoming Legislators are conducting their committee meetings in preparation for the upcoming session 2/12/2024. One of the issues we are very concerned with is the point of consumption protection of Certificated Service Territories (CST) for Wyoming's public utilities of which Carbon is one.

There are entities that have built facilities in one CST to serve electric service into other CST's and there are others considering to do the same. The issue with this activity is that the facilities that are built only benefit the single purpose that the facility is constructed for. CST's were established to make sure we were not constructing duplicate infrastructure so as to minimize the cost of electric service. When Carbon builds out our system it is available for all to benefit from. The closer to and the more reliable and affordable the electric system becomes as more users are added. When an entity is allowed to circumvent the CST. The public is the loser as the reason for the CST is no longer benefiting the public.

Contact your favorite legislator and let them know you voted for them to protect your electric service through the established CST.
